## Where can information regarding Small Business financial support be found?

• U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) disaster loans are now available. The COVID-19 pandemic has affected everyone in our economy, but we know small businesses have been particularly hard hit.

Online applications for these loans are open to Minnesota businesses at: <a href="https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela/">https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela/</a>

This program can provide low-interest loans of up to \$2 million to small businesses and private non-profits. These loans can go toward working capital to meet needs including payroll, accounts payable, and fixed debt payments that can't be paid due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The current interest rate is 3.75% for small businesses. The non-profit rate is 2.75%. These loans have long-term repayment options, up to a maximum of 30 years.  Governor Walz signed Executive Order 20-15 on March 23, 2020, directed DEED to develop a MN Small Business Emergency Loan Program to fund forgivable loans to small businesses, regardless of such business's organizational form (i.e. independent contractor, sole proprietorship, limited liability company, etc.).

The minimum loan is \$2,500 and the maximum is \$35,000 with no matching contribution required. More details can be found in <u>Executive Order 20-15</u>.

Staff has been dedicated to responding to phone calls and emails to electronically provide any documents prior to 1993 and other public data information requested.
